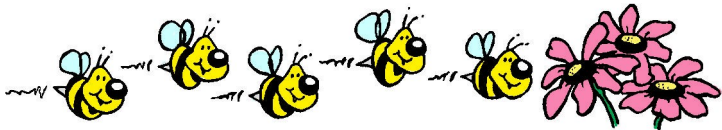
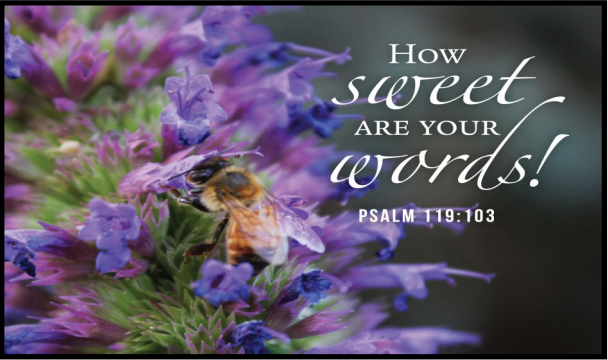

~Kubasko Korner~

One of the oldest songs in this series, “A Mighty Fortress is Our God” is a testament not only to the circumstances that inspired it but to the Scripture it is derived from. Penned by Martin Luther in 1529, the first line quotes the beginning of Psalm 46 - that God is a fortress and strength. Like the Psalm, Martin wrote this following a time of intense opposition. For the Psalmist, it had been the Assyrian invasion of Israel & God’s retaliation against them and, for Martin, it had been his encounters with the Catholic church that put his very life in jeopardy. Luther meant, in his early years of life, to fulfill his father’s dream of becoming a lawyer before ultimately becoming a monk following a near-death experience. Martin became a teacher and started to study the original Greek manuscripts of the Bible where he found the answers to his lifelong pursuit of God - that salvation came by faith and not by his own work. This led him to confront the Catholic church, and his multiple debates and attempted reforms of the church ultimately led to his life being endangered, his excommunication, and an invitation to the Diet of Worms where he was essentially put on trial for his beliefs. In all of this, God kept him safe and made his work successful, and God gave him a wife and family. So, some time between 1527 & 1529, he penned these words and wrote the hymn tune for the song which has been called “the Battle Hymn of the Reformation.” I pray that it continues to be our battle hymn today as we fight the forces of spiritual darkness in the world, for “Did we in our own strength confide, our striving would be losing were not the right Man on our side, the Man of God’s own choosing. You ask who that may be? Christ Jesus, it is he; Lord Sabaoth his name, from age to age the same; and he must win the battle.”

Utah Mission Trip:

Thank you to everyone who has been praying for, supporting, and encouraging our Utah Mission Team. We leave early this Saturday, and our prayer is that God would use us in the mission of Redemption Church there in northern Utah to bring more people out of darkness and to salvation in Christ! Less than 2% of people in Utah are evangelical Christians, so we are going to a dark corner of the world. Please continue to pray for myself, David O’Shields, Fred Brown, Hugh Sistare, Bonnie Mussman, Teri Hannon, and Donna Parker as we go, and as the Lord wills, we will come back to you with great news of what God is doing in Utah! If you want specific needs for prayer, I will list them below:

-**Sunday:** Pray for Redemption Church Bear River as we worship.

-**Monday:** Pray for the hearts of the people we are going to be meeting to be soft to the Gospel & open to the church.

-**Tuesday:** Pray as we leave doorhangers in neighborhoods and go to businesses.

-**Wednesday:** Pray as we meet first responders in the community and host a Block Party for Tremonton.

-**Thursday:** Pray for our work on Pioneer Day.

-**Friday:** Pray for the community to respond to outreach and be willing to try Redemption Church.
