
Trent's Two Cents:

Babylon & Beyond: The Sovereignty of God in the Book of Daniel (7-8)

Chapters 7 & 8 begin to recount the various visions that Daniel had in the latter years of his life. These two from these chapters begin to show Daniel the future plan of God although he doesn't understand it immediately. In fact these visions make up what we call an apocalypse, meaning "revealed" since God is revealing to him the plan of history. As R.C. Sproul best said it: "Apocalyptic literature unveils not chaos, but control—it shows that behind history's turmoil stands the sovereign hand of God." Let's start with the second chapter.

In chapter 8, we see a vision of a ram & a goat. As Daniel watches the ram first conquer only for himself to be conquered by the goat, he sees a little horn - a vision of power in the ancient world follow these two beasts. This horn stops the sacrifice - God's chosen system of worship - and attempts to separate God's people from Him. But ultimately this is unsuccessful, as the time for this conflict is named in evenings and mornings - a predetermined amount of time that God is allowing to happen and knows the beginning and end of. This passage describes what happens after the Persian empire (the ram) when the goat (Greece) would come under Alexander the Great. Following his death, his empire was split amongst four men, one of which was Antiochus who did stop the temple sacrifices until the Maccabees and their revolt liberated Jerusalem. It is amazing to watch God's hand in history accomplishing this prophecy.

In chapter 7, Daniel sees a vision of four beasts that progressively conquer each other until the fourth beast, more mighty than the rest, takes ultimate power. It is shown to have 10 horns again, a symbol of power - and fights against the people of God, but ultimately falls to the Son of Man & the Ancient of Days. This imagery would bring to the minds of Biblical readers the images of Psalm 110. It would also build on the foundation of earlier prophets to point to the Messiah here referenced as the Son of Man. Ultimately, this begins the pattern that we see all the way through John's Revelation - that history is playing out to God's plan. First, it did so by showing the path forward as empires came and fell until the Messiah would come. Second, and now for us, it also points to that same pattern being so until our King returns to us again.

Here is something interesting to consider in terms of the life of Daniel. Have you ever wondered how the wise men in the story of Jesus's birth knew where to go when they saw the star? Celestial bodies moving and changing is nothing new to the universe, so how did they know to look for something in the cosmos to symbolize the coming King of God's people? Wise men came "from the east" - more than likely being Persia where Daniel was now a wise man and the chief of all wise men. More than likely, God used these visions pointing to the coming of His Son to again illuminate the nations to the coming of Christ. This is why the wise men were looking for a sign - Daniel had told them to be watching for it!
