

DECEMBER FOOD PANTRY REPORT:

During this holiday season, we were able to minister to 243 families representing a total of 879 family members. We provided to them season greetings, weekly food support, and for Christmas, a food gift card to Quality Foods. Thanks to some of our staff, we also had a

"Christmas Story" book and a choice of toys for the children that attended on Saturday, December 16. The pantry was closed on 12/23 so our staff could enjoy the Christmas weekend. For the year 2023, we served 2490 clients representing 9082 family members. These clients came from 9 surrounding counties with the most from Greenville and Spartanburg counties. Moore News....

On Wednesday nights we have been walking through Romans 8 and we just recently studied verses 14-15, "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" Christians are sons and daughters of God and that is a wonderful truth that we should spend more time meditating on. I recently read a quote by J.I Packer who wrote about the importance of understanding our adoption as children of God, and I want to share this with you. Packer wrote, "You sum up the whole of New Testament teaching in a single phrase if you speak of it as a revelation of the Fatherhood of the holy Creator. In the same way, you sum up the whole of New Testament religion if you describe it as the knowledge of God as one's holy Father. If you want to judge how well a person understands Christianity, find out how much he makes of the thought of being God's child, and having God as his Father... For everything that Christ taught, everything that make the New Testament new, and better than the Old, everything that is distinctively Christian as opposed to merely Jewish, is summed up in the knowledge of the Fatherhood of God. 'Father' is the Christian name for God."
