





During this holiday season, we were able to minister to 243 families representing a total of 879 family members. We provided to them season greetings, weekly food support, and for Christmas, a food gift card to Quality Foods. Thanks to some of our staff, we also had a

"Christmas Story" book and a choice of toys for

the children that attended on Saturday, December 16. The pantry was closed on 12/23 so our staff could enjoy the Christmas weekend. For the year 2023, we served 2490 clients representing 9082 family members. These clients came from 9 surrounding counties with the most from Greenville and Spartanburg counties. Trent's Two Cents:

The Baltimore Ravens defeated the Houston Texans Saturday in the NFL playoffs. John Harbaugh, head coach of the Ravens, started his postgame press conference by reading a Bible verse. He quoted 1 Chronicles 29:11, which says, "Yours, O LORD, is the greatness, the power and the glory, the victory and the majesty; For all that is in heaven and in earth is Yours; Yours is the kingdom, O LORD, and You are exalted as head over all." After reading the verse Harbaugh said, "I want to give honor and glory where it is due.'

Two things stood out to me about this. First, it is amazing that an NFL coach, one win from playing in the Super Bowl, wanted to give God the glory for the team's success! Second, the passage he quoted is an Old Testament doxology! 1 Chronicles 29:11 is part of a prayer of praise for God's goodness to Israel. David said these words to Israel when he was charging Solomon and the people to build the Temple as a form of worship. This passage is an Old Testament doxology. In fact, during my preparation for the doxology sermon series, I read that the language the New Testament writers use in their doxologies most likely came from this passage. Notice the words and phrases that are in 1 Chronicles 29:10-14: "Now therefore, our God", "glory", "majesty", "kingdom", "power", "praise" 'you reign over all", "forever and ever". These are the very words and phrases Paul, Jude, Peter, and John use in their doxologies. It was great to hear a word of praise from Scripture in the media. May we be people praise in our daily lives who give God all the glory.

Portraits of Grace - Gideon (Judges 6-8; II Timothy 1:7)

Grace is a term we often hear, but not one we truly consider. We know that grace is unmerited favor from God and that it relies on nothing we have done, but we often think of grace only in the context of salvation only. But nothing could be further from the truth. We need the grace of God arguably more after salvation as we live godly lives in an ungodly world. So over the next few weeks, I wanted to present you some encouraging portraits of grace from God's Word that, I think, will show us more about the character and nature of God and how He uses us in spite of our

In the sixth chapter of the book of Judges, we are introduced to the man Gideon, a man whom we often remember for his daring attack on the Midianites in Judges 7. But the Gideon we are first introduced to has no valor in Him. In fact, our first picture of him is one of him working in secret for fear of the Midianites finding him. Even when God commands Him to contend with Midian, Gideon shows his fear by acknowledging his lowly place in his father's household, and when God tells him to tear down the false idols where he lives, Gideon again shows his fear by only doing so at night when he is out of sight of the town. Even as Gideon begins to follow God's instructions, he shows his fear again in testing God with a fleece and the morning dew. As Gideon began to trust God, he began to show more bravery and trust, knowing that God was not going to leave Him. Now what does this story show us about God? It shows us how patient and understanding God will be with us in that even when we are fearful and doubtful that He will show us the same patience that He gave to Gideon. Like Gideon, God wants us to trust Him and rely on His grace rather than our own ability since it is His power that truly has any kind of sustaining grace. Remember that "God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control," and his grace will sustain us even in our fear and doubt.
