

CHURCH ANNOUNCEMENT

Thank you to all who gathered for our church conference Sunday evening. Your presence, support, and unity in spirit were deeply appreciated. I was profoundly humbled by the weight of our vote—which was unanimous—to retire our debt. In that moment, God reminded me once again of how faithfully He provides for His children when we walk in obedience to His Word.

As someone still “young” in my salvation, this experience became another step in my spiritual growth. It echoed Trent’s message Sunday evening: though we are all spiritually thirsty, God stands ready to fill us, to refresh us, and to draw us deeper into relationship with Him when we come with open and obedient hearts. Several members have asked, “What happens now to the Kingdom Vision Fund since the debt is paid?” The answer is simple, it continues. God’s vision for His church does not end with the retirement of debt. His work moves forward, and the Kingdom Vision Fund remains a vital part of that calling. It becomes an investment in our missions, our children, our families, our growth, our community, and in all who need to hear the life-changing Word of God.

This investment may one day take the form of expanded educational spaces, facility improvements, or even new worship areas to welcome the growing number of people God will draw to this ministry. Whatever shape it takes, it will be guided by His purpose.

We come before God to give, not to get. And when we give faithfully to His vision, I can testify from personal experience that He continues to quench our thirst and bless us beyond measure.

I want to offer a special word of gratitude to my predecessor, Stuart Williams, who first established the Kingdom Vision Fund as a means of building God’s Kingdom with intentional generosity. I also want to thank Rev. Don L. Kelley for rekindling our awareness of the importance of retiring this debt during the Senior Adult service last spring. Though you could not be with us Sunday evening, Pastor Kelley, we could almost hear your voice lifted in praise at the news.

God has been exceedingly good to His Washington Baptist family. May our ongoing prayer be that we continue to honor Him, obey Him, and support His work with joyful and faithful hearts.

The Lord's Prayer - "Thy Kingdom Come"

One of the hardest concepts for us to always grasp when it comes to our modern reading of the Bible is the gap in cultural understanding we have between now and then. So we have to understand how a first century Jew or Gentile would have heard these statements from Jesus. When we do that, we often find that what Jesus was saying is much more direct and on-the-nose than we first imagined & helps us understand why so many people hated what He was saying. This next phrase of the Lord's Prayer is one such example. It simply reads "Thy Kingdom come," and we often take it at face value. Its underlying meaning, however, is extremely controversial. When we look at Mark 1, we see Jesus' initiation as a prophet as He is not only baptized in the Spirit but begins to proclaim to everyone that "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel (Mark 1:15)." So when Jesus enters into His ministry, He is proclaiming that the true Kingdom of God has been initiated through His proclamation of it. This was a common practice of the time - heralds would proceed kings and announce their arrival. Christ is doing the same thing here, but of course He is not only the herald/prophet of God's kingdom but is also the King Himself. To a Jewish listener, then, He was making Himself known as the Messiah that they believed would perform this function while also subverting Caesar and the Roman system of government.

The word "kingdom" here, however, has a deep meaning. It can be understood better by the terms "sovereignty" or "reign," and point to the act of reigning rather than a physical kingdom. The idea points us to the reality that we live in the tension of a kingdom that is and is to come. At this moment in time, Christ the Son rules and reigns over all the world in a kingdom given to Him by God the Father. There is still a moment in time when Christ will reign physically here on earth as well and that kingdom will be made whole at the end of all things. So what does the prayer mean for us now? If we are to understand it correctly, the idea is that when we pray for the kingdom of God to come, we are praying for God's reign to be made complete in the world and ourselves right now. I hope that's on our mind each time we pray and for everything we pray.
