

# Clothes Closet Update





# ~Kubasko Korner~

The Beatitudes - The Hungry & Thirsty (Matthew 5:6)

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." These words from Jesus show us one of the focal points of the Christian life as well as the core part of the Christian's heart. Jesus here is imploring those who seek Him to see their spiritual pursuit as all men see their physical pursuits of hunger and thirst. Hunger and thirst were common in the ancient world as shortages were common based on world events and weather. People could potentially travel long distances to find these resources, and the picture Jesus is giving us here is one of intentionality. We should be seeking out righteousness and holiness - the very character and nature of God - the same we strive and work for that which satisfies our hunger and thirst. Unlike our physical needs, however, Jesus promises that in Him all our spiritual needs are satisfied. The Greek word here indicates not just a satiation, but an overabundance of His provision. The message here is very simple for us - nothing else will satisfy us but Jesus & our faith in Him. Even Jesus Himself says this to the devil when He quotes Deuteronomy: "It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." He also says something similar to the woman at the well: "whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again." What does our pursuit of His righteousness say about us?

### Moore News ....

In the one-year Bible reading plan that goes from Genesis to Revelation, you are currently reading in the book of Numbers.

The book of Numbers is about a God who faithfully leads and confronts an unfaithful nation. Numbers provides the account of Israel leaving Mt. Sinai, their journeying to the Promised Land, their failure to enter the Promised Land, and the consequences that followed. Numbers sheds light on the extended season of discipline in the wilderness. This was a time when Israel was supposed to learn to wait on and follow God as they journeyed to the promised land and as they hoped for the promised Messiah. Instead, Israel rejected the God who was more than able to give them the Promised Land (Num 13-14). Their rebellion led to God's punishment, which was the generation that rebelled would not live to see the Promised Land. Israel continued to test the Lord, which resulted in many punishments for their unfaithfulness. One of the key punishments is found in Numbers 21:4-9. After the generation that wandered in the desert died, a new generation arose to enter the Promised Land (Num 26-36). In Numbers 24, God uses Balaam, a pagan prophet, to pronounce blessings on the nation of Israel. In the fourth oracle, Balaam announced that God is sovereign and has complete control over the world and all its affairs, which extends to the promised Messiah.

The book of Numbers points to God's faithfulness to a sinful people. We see an example of this in Numbers 21 with Moses and the bronze serpent, which ultimately points us to Jesus (John 3:14-15). God's faithfulness was not unique to Israel. God remains faithful today to a sinful people. Numbers provides insight into how Israel went back and forth between rebellion and triumph, and Paul expounds on this and provides a warning to Christians in his letter to the Corinthians. Paul writes, "Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did (1 Cor 10:6)."
