

WHAT'S UP at Washington



This one hour session course dives into the intersection of the Bible and history aiming to deepen our understanding of the biblical narrative and its real-world context, so that we can see the Bible as one connected story of God's plan, understand it, and apply it to our lives.



A joint recommendation from the Deacons, Budget and Finance, Building & Grounds, and the Safety Team was presented during the February 16th Church Conference.

We have an immediate need to upgrade to our security system because of age and integration, to include the purchase and installation of 40 new cameras and cabling. This is necessary to address our aging equipment (15+ Years) and facilitate the integration with the new server. We have sourced 3 competitive quotes; \$31K, \$32K, and \$37K.

The recommendation is for the \$32K quote. A motion will be made, and Questions will be taken regarding this matter

during the March 16th Church Conference. Since this is an unbudgeted expense, funds would come from either savings or Special Projects.

The Beatitudes - The Merciful (Matthew 5:7)

Mercy is not by any stretch of the imagination a normal reaction of the human spirit. More than often, the response we have to those we view with enmity or those we view as lower than us is one in which we fantasize that they deserve what they're getting. This is no different in Jesus's time, as "In the Greco-Roman world, mercy was not always considered a virtue, as strength and power were often more highly valued." And even though mercy is advocated throughout the Bible, we know that it was not practiced actively by even many of the Jewish religious elite - think of the priest passing the man by in the story of the good Samaritan. So when Jesus shares this blessing for the merciful, He is again pointing to the blessing to be found by sharing with others what He would share with us on the cross. The Greek word for mercy "is used in the New Testament to express the act of showing mercy or compassion towards someone [and] often implies a deep sense of empathy and a desire to alleviate the suffering or need of another." We see this used throughout the New Testament by Jesus and the apostles, but this tense of the word is only used twice. The first is here in Matthew 5 and the other is in Hebrews 2:17, where Christ is called our merciful High Priest. So what is the difference with this tense of mercy? Isn't all mercy just mercy? Why did they decide to use a different tense here? The answer is actually quite simple in that the mercy referenced in these two passages speaks of "[mercy] acting consistently with the revelation of God's covenant." This is a mercy that we can see all the way back to the story of Adam and Eve tracing through Israel's history until the arrival of Jesus on the earth - a mercy that relates to God's promise to save us. So let's look at the verse in Matthew again with that in mind - "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy," or the Braxton translation: "Blessed are [those who believe and show the mercy that God planned and gave us all as sinners], for they shall receive [that] mercy." The theme of the Beatitudes continues to show itself to us week by week - God's people are defined and blessed by their realization of their sin, their repentance before God, put their faith entirely in Him, center their lives around Him, and now show others that same Gospel mercy they have been shown. Christ stands right now on our behalf pleading our innocence to God by His own blood, so are we going to plead with others that exact mercy so that they too will receive it?
