

Trent's Two Cents:

Sunday began the Week of Prayer for North American Missions and the start of our collection of the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Our church goal is year is \$10,000. Every penny of this offering goes to train, equip, and send missionaries across North America. Annie Armstrong was born in 1850 in Baltimore, Maryland and she developed a heart for missions at an early age. Annie's main goal was to promote local church involvement in missions through fund raising and education. She organized the WMU, developed a fundraising system, and wrote thousands of letters to raise support for missionaries and educational materials. She used all her talents resources, energy, and connections to accomplish her goal. In one year alone (1893). Annie wrote over 18,000 letters for the cause of missions. Remember, Annie wrote every letter by hand and relied on the postal system to deliver them. Today, with computers, copiers, and social media, we can reach the world with the click of a few buttons. Just think what could happen if we all worked as hard as she did for the cause of Christ! Annie Armstrong once said, "What a glorious thing it is to be a co-worker with God in winning the world for Christ." Whatever Annie did, she did it with all her heart, for the glory of God (Colossians 3:23). Annie Armstrong is buried in Baltimore, Maryland, and her tombstone says it all: "She hath done what she could." May we do all we can for the cause of Christ. (trent@washingtonbaptist.org)






WBC Food Pantry Report:

his faith in the face of his fear.

We see a similar story in the Old Testament. God had commanded the Israelites to enter the Promised Land in triumph and conquer their enemies there, but the people saw the challenge ahead and instead of depending on God's strength, they had faith in themselves...just like Peter. They turned their back on God, refused to go forward in boldness out of fear and instead wanted to stay in the desert where they were comfortable and safe. When God's wrath was kindled against them, they -like Peter - found themselves wishing they had followed God and had faith!

God calls us to be a people of boldness and not of fear. Paul writes that we as believers do not have a spirit of fear but of "power, love, and sound judgment." But all of that relies on us showing the faith that God has called us to. If we have faith in ourselves, we not only depend on our own righteousness, but we also find ourselves full of fear because we cannot do anything without Christ. Think about Peter before and after the death of Christ. Before Christ, he was hasty and full of fear. Afterwards, he is full of wisdom and faith. Before, he was running for his own survival. After, he is standing before thousands proclaiming Christ. Before, he denies Christ in His presence. After, he dies on an upside down cross after refusing to deny His Lordship. Faith gave Peter a peace beyond all under standing and a strength that he would never have on his own. Remember, the call to us is the same that it was to Christ's disciples, followers, and to the people of Israel: "No one will be able to stand against you as long as you live. I will be with you, just as I was with Moses. I will not leave you or forsake you. "Be strong and courageous, for you will distribute the land I swore to their fathers to ive them as an inheritance. Above all, be strong and very courageous to carefully observe the whole instruction My servant Moses commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right or the left, so that you will have success wherever you go. This book of instruction must not depart from your mouth; you are to recite it day and night so that you may carefully observe everything written in it. For then you will prosper and succeed in whatever you do. Haven't I commanded you: be strong and courageous? Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.

Faithlessly Fearful - Deuteronomy 1:19-42; Luke 22:31-34, 54-62; John 18:15-18, 25-27 We often think of Peter in the later years of his life - the selfless, faithful, steadfast, and encouraging disciple who walked by the side of Christ and encouraged thousands of early Christians. His writings till encourage millions more today! We think of him as a leader in the hall of fame of believers, and yet we forget the Peter of the gospels - the disciple who is sinful and in need of a Savior.

Peter stands out as an example of this in the narrative of the Easter story. As we see in Luke and John, he hastily tells Christ that he is ready to pay the ultimate price for Him. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he even cuts off the ear of a servant of the High Priest. And yet, with all this, Peter those there. The book of Luke even tells us that Christ looked into the eyes of Peter on the third denial as he fulfilled Christ's words. This look must have resonated with Peter the words that Christ had said to him on the Sea of Galilee, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Peter did not show
