
WMU MINISTRY TEAM

The Beatitudes - The Reward (Matthew 5:11-12)

As we conclude our study of the Beatitudes, we come to the final blessing that Jesus gives to His listeners in words that echo the Last Supper - that we as His people are blessed when we are persecuted, slandered, and hated for the sake of Christ. In our world today, this idea seems backward to us as we are so used to retaliation in our culture. In this command, He sums up the rest - that as we seek Him, know Him, lead others to Him, and suffer for Him - and tells us that in the - that as we seek Him, know Him, lead others to Him, and suffer for Him - and tells us that in the end we can rejoice and give God praise when we encounter these trials because our heavenly reward will be far greater than anything this world could ever give us. This message was not only radical in His time, but radical in ours. Our lives should be defined by living a life in which we follow Christ & His teachings and seek after these blessings He bestows on His people. His example of the prophets is more than appropriate - men who followed after God through suffering. To the world they seemed as nothing, they show us how to suffer for the Gospel. Like them and the early church, let us be a people "who [rejoice] that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name [of Jesus]." (Acts 5:41)

I wanted to put a word in here for our Youth Worship Team - Noah, Maddi, Macie, Matthew, Maggie, and Natalie - who did a fantastic job leading worship this past Sunday evening! Summary of Ruth The book of Ruth begins with a short

introduction, which presents Elimelech and

introduction, which presents Elimelech and his family traveling from Bethlehem to the country of Moab due to a famine in the land (Ruth 1:1-5). Elimelech died in Moab along with his two sons who married two Moabite women, Orpah and Ruth, leaving Naomi widowed. This tragedy leaves Naomi with no hope for a future. Naomi hears that the famine is over and decides to return to Bethlehem and her daughter in-law, Ruth, remains loyal to her as she journeyed with her. Ruth said to Naomi, "Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go, I will go, and where you lodge, I will lodge (Ruth 1:16)." They returned to Bethlehem and Naomi felt empty as she returned without her family (Ruth 1:20).

In chapter two, there is hope revealed through Name of the same of In chapter two, there is hope revealed through Naomi's kinsman Boaz as God would lead Ruth to Boaz's field to glean. Boaz acknowledged Ruth's loyalty to Naomi, and he viewed her loyalty as seeking refuge in God (Ruth 2:12). Boaz was a potential redeemer, which provides Naomi with hope

The book of Deuteronomy explains that a redeemer could perpetuate the family name of the deceased through a new marriage (Deut 25:5-10). Naomi formed a plan for Ruth to push the subject of marriage on Boaz according to the levirate custom (Ruth 3:9). Boaz agreed to the proposal, but he knew he was not the nearest redeemer, which presented a challenge (Ruth 3:10-13).

In chapter four, Boaz revealed the cost of the land that belonged to Elimelech, and the nearest redeemer refused to take Ruth as his wife (Ruth 4:5-6). This allowed Boaz to purchase, "All that belonged to Elimelech and all that belonged to Chilion and to Mahlon (Ruth 4:9)," and to take Ruth as his wife. Boaz and Ruth married, and they had a son Obed, who was the father of Jesse, who was the father of David (Ruth 4:13-17).

Application of Ruth

The book of Ruth ends in a way that highlights the line of David, providing a redemptive hope through the future Messiah (Ruth 4:18-22). Jason DeRouchie states that, "God promised to do through David's future son on a national level what Boaz supplied on a personal level. Just as God delivered David's ancestors from exile in Moab through a kinsman Redeemer from Bethlehem, the promise of this book is that He would do the same thing for David's descendants (DeRouchie, 6.45)." Further, the book of Buth highlights the convenients and providence of God as He guided Buth to Page which book of Ruth highlights the sovereignty and providence of God as He guided Ruth to Boaz, which ultimately led her to be an ancestor of our Redeemer, Jesus (Matthew 1:5).
