Scripture We Sing - "Come, Thou Almighty King" In 1757, a hymn was published in a collection along with John Wesley's hymns that we still sing to this day. That hymn, "Come, Thou Almighty King," is today debated in terms of its authorship, but it most likely comes from someone in the circle of John Wesley as anonymous publishing was common at the time. But the theology of the song is rich - the reason it is still widely sung today. Each stanza is formulated around the actions of God and speaks of the church as a whole rather than as individuals. It is obvious in each of the four stanzas that it is the work of God in each of His Trinitarian Persons that moves us, molds & shapes us, and gives us the guidance and grace we need each and every time we gather together as His people. The first stanza specifically references God the Father as the King - the Rule & Sustainer of all things - bringing to mind the picture of the Ancient of Days from Daniel 7 and asking His continued help and strength as we praise Him, while the second stanza then turns to the Son - Jesus Christ - and immediately reminds us of His characterization throughout Scripture - the Word of God (John 1), the leader of God's armies (Joshua 5), and our High Priest Who hears our prayers and prays the Spirit of God come to us (Hebrews 5:7, 8:1-2; John 14:15-17). The Holy Spirit is the object of the third stanza, again labeled by His title from John 14 - the Comforter and shown in the image of our Advocate - the One who bears witness to us of the Scripture's truths (Rom. 8:16) and renews us constantly (Ezekiel 37, Romans 12:1-2). The final stanza speaks of all three Persons of the Trinity - the great One in Three - worthy of all the reverence and fear He deserves now and forever for His sovereign power and love that we will experience now and forever (Jude 1:25, Rev. 5:13-14). Overall, this hymn is one of the most fitting songs for worship that we could ever hope to find: a reminder of what God does in our midst every time we worship, a reminder to center our hearts around His purpose and His ways when we come to worship, and a reminder of Who He is - our God in three Persons, forever worthy of our praise and adoration, and always willing to help us as we praise Him each and every time we worship together!
