<complex-block></complex-block>	Greetings Washington Baptist Brothers & Sisters in Christ! Unfortunately, I will not be able to present the April Finance Report at our May 19th Conference. I do, however, wish to share a quick summary from the Budget & Finance Committee regarding April's performance. Please use this summary as a guide when reviewing the April Financials which will be available at the Sunday services. • Checking Account Balance as of April 30, 2024, was \$65K. • Contributions to the General Fund were below the budgeted giving by \$5,700. YTD, we are still ahead of the budgeted giving by \$21,467. • Kingdom Vision contributions in April were \$1,400 below the target. The good news is that YTD – we have exceeded the '23–'24 goal by \$74,000. For a total of \$138K. • Total Expenses for April were \$12K under budget. We are net positive at \$200,627 below the current YTD budget. • \$38,945 or 34% of the March giving, was made electronically. • In addition to our scheduled building loan Principal Payment of \$12,089, we made an additional payment of \$20K, reducing the outstanding balance to \$1,100,946. • Through the first 8 months of this church financial year, we are favorable to budget by nearly \$300K. (Yes, that is very good!!!!) • When reviewing the balance sheet, you will see a new account; 1117 ED Jones. We created this account with a generous gift from the Pennington Family Estate. It will be earning 5.3% interest, and we have access at any time. This brings our investment account total to \$924,517! • With 66% of the budget year complete, we have 18 cost centers in "Red" as of month end. Our constitution states that the Budget and Finance Committee is responsible for reporting this to the congregation. This is due to timing issues of one-time budgeted expenses payouts. • In May we will see a reduction in Employee Benefits of \$900+/month because of a new health insurance plan. • Budget request forms have been published (please pick yours up asap!). The intent is to ensure that all forms are returned by Jun

## ~Kubasko Korner~

Last week, we looked at how the people of God will be distinctive according to Peter and in today's passage he picks up with this idea by comparing Christians to a "living stone" that has been rejected (v. 4). This, of course, is a reference to the fact that we are in Christ and that Christ was the "stone that the builders rejected," and that those who are in Christ become the stones on which He builds His church (v. 5-8). This becomes a defined line between Christians and unbelievers that the believer should be seen from his actions to be one and that those of the world will in no way have compatibility with God's Word because they don't obey it (v. 8). Jesus tells us this Himself in the book of John: "If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you (Jn. 15:18)." We will always be at odds with the world because we are not of it; for as Peter says, we as Christians are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation (v. 9-10)." Paul says this in a different way, referring to the first time these terms were used - in Moses's days and pointing out that God's covenant has always been through faith to those who believe Him and the One He sent (Ex. 19:6, Rom. 1:16-17, 9:8). But it's the final two verses that further point out the divide between Christians and the world as Peter labels us as sojourners and exiles (v. 11-12). The image to our minds here should be that of Israel wandering in the wilderness away from Egypt and towards their new home that God promised them, for their fate and ours is the same - Christ, our greater Moses, is leading us to the eternal life He has promised us! "Oh praise the One Who leads us on, for His grace will bring us home!"
