are studying Explore The Bible series, you will be in the books of Jeremiah and Lamentations. The first session, God sent Jeremiah to his people in Judah's darkest hour. ~Kubasko Korner~ Now What: The Church in Crisis - Gnosticism (II Timothy 4:2-4, Matthew 7:7-23)

The Church has always had to fight for Truth. Christ tells us to "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves" while He is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life." We, then, as believers, are Truth seekers, and our source is God's Word. Paul tells us



in II Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired, "breathed out," by God, and are profitable to our lives. In Hebrews, God's Word is compared to a sword that cuts to reveal our hearts and implant Truth in us. Truth, however, is not always easy to see in the moment, and hindsight is always easier for us recognize what is true. History tells us the Church was often attacked within, and Paul himself wrote that "the time will come when they will not tolerate sound doctrine" and instead turn with itching ears to teachers who will turn them away from Truth to silly myths. Certainly the most dangerous of these in the early church was the heresy of Gnosticism, which claimed Jesus was not God and that true redemption was only found by your own experience and perception. In fact, it was so pervasive that the church father Irenaeus wrote a five book work called "Against Heresies" to disprove the Gnostics. The conflict continued all the way until the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

God was faithful in providing for His Church in faithful teaching and providential care. Gnosticism faded away, but there is a lesson to be learned from this era. First, to be armed in Truth at all times, "ready to give a defense" for the Scriptures (I Peter 3:15). Second, we must be ready to use God's Word like the Bereans to test everything around us, especially things that are claiming to be godly, and defend Truth (Acts 17:10-12). Jesus told us in Matthew 7:21-23 that not all who say "Lord, Lord" will enter

heaven. We often miss that the repetition of that word means the one who says it is convinced they are wielding Truth, and tell of all they have done in Truth's name. But Jesus Himself has said He is the Way...He is the Gate...the narrow way, and those that love Him will do His will and be steeped in His Scriptural Truth. Are you ready to defend
