


### Trent's Two Cents:

Sunday morning I preached on the life of King Manasseh in 2 Chronicles 33. The first 10 verses provide an overview of his sin and wickedness, which included idolatry, witchcraft, and child sacrifice. As we read the list we are appalled by his actions. However, the list concludes with a simple but profound statement: "The LORD spoke to Manasseh and his people, but they would not listen." (2 Chronicles 33:10). This is a big statement. Manasseh did not fall into sin because he was ignorant about the ways of God. God spoke to him through His Word and His prophets. Manasseh knew right from wrong. Manasseh knew what God expected of him. He just ignored it and chose not to obey.

Sadly, I think we are often guilty of this. We know what the Bible says. We know what to do. We just don't do it. God has spoken to us; we just don't listen. We say we want to know God's will for our lives in specific situations, yet we do not listen or obey his clear instruction concerning our daily living. God has told us to go and make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19),

to love one another as He has loved us (John 15:12), to bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2), to abstain from sexual immorality (1 Thessalonians 4:3), to be kind and forgiving toward one another (Ephesians 4:32), and to give thanks in all things (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Are we paying attention to what He is saying? Do we listen? Do we obey? Are we really seeking His guidance and direction, or are we doing things just on our own, according to our own thoughts? I pray we will be doers of the Word, and not hearers only (James 1:22).

## ~Kubasko Korner~

### Now What: The Church in Crisis—Nicaea

### (II Timothy 4:3-4, 7; I Peter 3:15; Hebrews 12:1-2)

When we defend the Truth, we shouldn't always expect an immediate result. After all, everything is in God's timing and under His sovereignty. As the story goes, George Mueller prayed for five of his friends to come to know Christ. Some believed quickly, while it took 52 years for the last of his five friends to come to know Christ. In that whole time, Mueller continued to pray. In fact, his last friend came to know Christ after Mueller's death. In the same way, we have to expect to defend God's Truth for our whole lives, and we may not see what God does through how we stand on His Truth. That is why it's good to "always [be] ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, but with gentleness and respect."

For their first 300 years, the Church had to be on guard. Paul's words began to ring true: "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths." Scripture was questioned, added to, and subtracted from. Many stood up to those who brought these teachings, and finally a council was convened in the city of Nicaea in 325 to make the Church's position clear on the Truth of Scripture.

What came out of this four month meeting is what is held as the standard summation of what Christians believe we called the Nicene Creed. It affirmed what the Bible had to say about God the Father, the Son, and the Spirit, and remains in use even today in churches all across the world. It took 300 years of defense to land here, but the outcome has lasted even until today. We must always be ready to defend the Truth with every moment of our lives. Are you ready?
