Babylon & Bevond: The Sovereignty of God in the Book of Daniel The Book of Daniel continues to be one of the most applicable books of the Old Testament even to this day, as its message of hope in a difficult world is relatable for us in our time. The story of Daniel begins where the historical books of the Bible end - with the conquering of the southern kingdom of Judah, the exile of God's people, and ultimately the destruction of Jerusalem. In its characters - Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah - we get a picture of what the lives of the exiles were like as they went into a new land with new cultures and pressures. These young men are given roles in the king's court, placing them under immense cultural and spiritual pressure. Yet, in spite of these things, we see that God time and time again gives them success and shows Himself to be sovereign against not only Babylon but the successive empires and kings that follow. Many readers find this book challenging because of its vivid prophetic visions—a type of writing known as apocalyptic literature. The word 'apocalypse' simply means 'to unveil' or 'to reveal.' In Daniel's case, these visions pull back the curtain on God's plans for the future and the coming of the Messiah. In fact, this book is second only to the book of

Isaiah in terms of the sheer volume of what is revealed about the coming Messiah. But the book of Daniel also shows us that the people of God were doing what God instructed them to through the prophet Jeremiah while they waited - "Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare (Jeremiah 29:5, 7)." God was telling His people that their Savior is coming and that until He comes we should build the kingdom of God right where we are. That is a message that we can still live out today.

So over the coming weeks, I want us to dive into this book together and its implications for us as God's people. We will see not only what God has done in the lives of Daniel and others, but what He wants to do in your life and in our church. We will get direction from God's sovereignty over history here and use it to seek His direction today. Ultimately, we will, like Daniel, all have opportunities to stand for God, but the question is will we stand for Him or crumble to the pressure and allure of the world? A song I learned as a child says it well: Dare to be a Daniel, dare to stand alone, dare to have a purpose firm, dare to make it known.
