We are actively engaged in our community in a variety of ways (food pantry, clothing closet, VBS, SAM Camp, Greer Christian Learning Center, etc.). We are also actively engaged in evangelism across the nation by partnering with ministries and churches in North Carolina, Kentucky, Virginia, and Idaho, and will soon have a partnership in Utah. Internationally, we are involved by supporting the Hendersons in their efforts to help pastors and missionaries across the world, and we are currently exploring new opportunities for an international mission effort in 2026. In addition to these personal engagements we also give monetarily to local, state, national, and international missions. This is what we are called to do.

I am proud of those who have personally sought out mission opportunities on their own. Two I know of who have done this recently are Nan Spearman and Paul Shanks. Nan went on a trip to Costa Rica with a team from local churches and ministered in a variety of ways to a wide range of people. Paul takes medical mission trips with Samaritan's Purse and provides eye care for many in need. Paul went to Kenya earlier this year and is currently in Uganda. It is wonderful to see members of our church seeking out opportunities and going to the world with the gospel. 



Babylon & Beyond: The Sovereignty of God in the Book of Daniel (1:5-21)

One of the central themes of the book of Daniel is the testing of faith. We see this from the outset of the book in today's passage when the faithfulness of not only Daniel, but his three friends are tested as they leave Israel and come into Babylon. They are integrated into the king's household, which would bring with it many opportunities where they could go against God's Law. Daniel, knowing what the Law of God says, makes a deal with the head of the king's household where they would not transgress God's law and be tested with the results of that.

Why did he make this challenge? Did he know the outcome of the situation? Of course not! None of us knows the exact plan of God, but Daniel and his friends knew God's Word so well that he knew that God's laws and God's promises were still true even in exile. Because they knew this, they stepped out in faith knowing it was not up to them to fix or solve the situation, but instead to give God control and obey what God had commanded them to do out of the love they had for Him.

There were three possible outcomes in this situation. The first was to fully integrate themselves into the king's house and disobey God's law which they didn't want to do. The second was to try to solve the problem themselves in their own strength, whereby they would be inadvertently abdicating God of His power and sovereignty and become their own god. The third was to obey, and they did not know whether this would work out or not. But what they did know was that their God was faithful, and He would work it out one way or the other. The question for us today is are we obeying God's Word and giving Him each and every situation?

On August 10th, I hope you are able to join us for our Annual Ministry Fair at 6pm in the Fellowship Hall!
