

Babylon & Beyond: The Sovereignty of God in the Book of Daniel (2:31-49)

Today's passage shows the interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar's dream - a message from God to the most powerful ruler in the world - through Daniel. In it, the king is not given a message that benefits him, as it first shows an image of a man made out of different materials - gold, silver, bronze, iron, & clay - that is then destroyed by a rock from an unseen force. Daniel goes on to explain that it represents the empires of man stacked one upon the other as one takes over from the next. The unseen force, however, is revealed to be God's hand. What this means for the king is that his empire will not last - a realization that all of us have to make in regard to our own lives. At the end of it all, there is only one thing that will remain - the Kingdom of God. This story already begins to prelude one of the main themes of the whole book - the coming Messiah and the Kingdom of God made manifest on the earth. When you line up each of these empires from the dream, what you find is that it ends at the feet of iron and clay - something hard and yet easily breakable. Ironically, this lines up with the history of the Roman Empire easily, and what does Jesus say when He enters His ministry? "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." Daniel has repeated links over and over again as to how God is working through history to bring His Son into the world. So rest assured, Christian, if your soul is tied to the Lord's, you are secure no matter what arises in life and in death - we belong to Christ alone.

As the new school year draws closer, I would encourage everyone to take advantage of the opportunities we have at our church to find a place to learn and a place to serve. Coming up in the next month and a half, we have Family Bowling Night for the whole church, our Prayer Walk For Our Schools & Ministries, the Ministry Fair, and Discipleship Courses starting (3 in September and 1 in August). Moore News:

We are in the book of Proverbs in our Bible reading plan. Below is a summary of the

The purpose of the book of Proverbs is found in the introduction, as it is outlined by five infinitive verbs: to know, to discern, to receive, to give, and to understand (Prov 1:2-7). Mark Rooker wrote that Proverbs is, "Like an instructional manual to lead people in right-

ous living before God."

The first nine chapters give the reader two choices to follow: the way of wisdom or the way of folly. This section of the book focuses on a wise son who hears and keeps his parents' instruction, resulting in life and a knowledge of God (Prov 1:8, 1:10, 2:1,5). This section of the book Solomon also portrays both wisdom and folly as women (Prov 1:20, 9:4-6, 9:13-16). Jason DeRouchie explains that Solomon, "Develops this feminine gender to identify how wisdom should be attractive to his royal heir or heirs and how foolishness is destructively alluving."

Chapters ten through thirty-one consist of what is commonly recognized to be proverbs. The majority of proverbs are concise statements designed to help the reader easily remember the ways of wisdom. There are other proverbs that only make sense in a specific remember the ways of wisdom. There are other proverbs that only make sense in a specific context. For example, Proverbs 26:4-5 reads, "Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest you be like him yourself. Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own eye." These two statements seem contradictory, but depending on the situation, the two statements teach that there will be times when it is wise to respond to a fool and other times it is not. There are proverbs that are absolute in terms of their truth as they relate to the immutable character of God. A great example is found in Proverbs 19:21, "Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the LORD that will stand." Lastly, there are proverbial promises that point us to the future. The believer does not experience the immediate truths of these promises, but one day will fully realize them on the other side of glory. A great example is found in Proverbs 10:27, "The fear of the LORD prolongs life, but the years of the wicked will be short." Christians understand that on earth, that is not always true, but in light of eternity, this proverb is certainly true.

of eternity, this proverb is certainly true.

Proverbs ends with the ideal wife (Prov 31:10), and this woman presents the wise character and virtues that are emphasized throughout the entire book (Rooker, 535).
