



When we left off last week, Nebuchadnezzar did not want to harm Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. He seemingly did not take their defiance to bowing to his golden image too personally, even giving them a second chance that they refuse. Now, we are told his countenance changes - again, this would have probably been viewed as an act of disloyalty - and he is forced to cement himself as a leader and punish them appropriately. In fact, he orders the furnace made even hotter to make an example of them, and he loses several of his own men in the process. Binding them in all their clothes, this was meant to show that there was no defying him as the king of Babylon. I always love to imagine that Nebuchadnezzar returns to his chair expecting to hear screams and then hears nothing. He looks up to see what's happening, and realizes something is off - there are four people in the fire, but they are not burning. His fury fades into panic as he asks his counselors how many people they cast into the furnace, only to finally realize who the fourth one is - God Himself. In that moment, he must have realized the mistake he had made - the young men were right when they had said God would save them, and if he couldn't execute them like this then he wouldn't be able to stop God any other way.

When we walk through the fire, we are never alone, and through Christ we are always more than conquerors.

Moore News:

The reading of Isaiah has come into the mix in our Bible reading plan. I wrote a summary of Isaiah for an assignment in seminary that I hope will help you as you read.

The book of Isaiah starts with an introduction, highlighting in the first chapter the terrible state of the nation of Israel (Isa 1:4; 5-6, 7-8, 11, 17-20), but chapter one also reveals the answer for Israel's problems as God would do a work to bring restoration to Israel (Isa 1:26-27).

Chapters 2-39 reveal a new section of the book, covering the punishment and hope connected to Judah, but also the entire world. Through the judgement, one can see Israel's hope as one reads about the Holy Seed (Isa 6:13), a light to the darkness (Isa 9:2), a child that would be called, "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace (Isa 9:6)." Isaiah is anticipating the coming Messiah, who would be a signal and a light for all people; and he will lead not only ethnic Israel, but all the nations in a new exodus back to the presence of God (Isa 11:10-16) (DeRouchie, Lecture on Isaiah).

In chapters 13-39, one finds that God will punish all nations, but these chapters also reveal that God will save a remnant from all nations (Isa 19:24-25). In the midst of worldwide punishment, we find that salvation is offered to all people who trust in Him.

The rest of the book covers God's plan for global salvation and the new creation (DeRouchie, Lecture on Isaiah), God's plan for global salvation would be worked through His Spirit-empowered servant (Isa 42:1), who would be a light for the nations, bringing out all of those imprisoned in darkness (Isa 42:6-7). Isaiah reveals two stages of restoration as he anticipates Israel's future exile. Stage one of restoration consists of Israel returning to Jerusalem (42:18-43:21), while stage two highlights their need to be reconciled to God (44:24-48:22). For stage one, God would use Cyrus of Persia to bring the people back to the land and rebuild the temple in Jerusalem (Isa 44:24-48:22). For stage two, God would use His Holy Servant to reconcile His people of both Israel and the nations (Isa 49:1, 3; 5-6) (DeRouchie, Lecture on Isaiah). This reconciling work of God's Holy Servant is beautifully explained in Isaiah 52:13-53. In this great passage, the substitutionary atoning work of Christ is revealed for, "He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities...and by His wounds we are healed" (Isa 53:5). At the end of the book, Isaiah reveals a multiethnic offspring rising out of the atoning work of Christ and people from all nations are adopted by faith into Christ and His work, and therefore becoming children of the living God.
