



What is the Community of Believers?

Hebrews 10:19-25, Proverbs 17:27, Colossians 2:1-8

One of the greatest revelations from the Bible is the consistency of mankind. We see in its pages that from the earth's creation until the end of the first century after Christ not much has changed about us. We are sinners in need of a Savior, we want to go our own way, and we think that we know better than God. We see this today in our world, and it's a reminder to us that nothing has changed about us - we need Christ just as much today as we did from the very beginning. What this also shows us is not just our consistency as humans, but also God's consistency from Creation onward. His plan is for us to know Him, believe in Him, repent of sin. and to live in new life that He gives to us, and perhaps the second greatest tool He has given us for this, next to the Bible, is the community of believers. This would be our churches who journey life together "[stirring] up one another to love and good works;" and yet, we also know that there are millions who claim to be a part of the family of God and yet are surprisingly distant from churches as the writer of Hebrews says. Many claim that church is too political or judgmental, or they feel that their own personal relationship with Christ is all that is needed. But what does God intend for us?

First, we see that God meant the church to be transformational. The work that begins with salvation is "carried unto completion" by being together as believers hearing and living together the Word of God, pursuing Him in holiness, and continually evaluating ourselves and each other by God's Word and reminding ourselves of the work of Christ. We honor and remember Him in the taking of the Lord's Supper, we preach and sing the Word faithfully, we wait to see how God transforms hearts through salvation, and we baptize and make disciples in His name. The Church, reliant on God's Word, is a transformational tool that He intended to be accomplished through a community of transformed souls being renewed in mind and spirit every day together. Second, then, God intended the church to be supportive. It's a place where we can live and grow in being honest with others about our needs and struggles. As long as we try to act like perfect and put-together people we will remain stagnant and fearful. Instead, God wants us to come alongside each other and sharpen each other through study and prayer. This is another ground that leads to that transformational nature of the church. And that all leads to, third, the fact that the church is missional. Jesus did not tell us to sit around and wait for Him, but to go to all nations - that's an explicit command. So if we stay within the walls of our church and do nothing to go to the world as individuals and as a church, we are sinning against God. All of this summarizes the church because all of it describes our God - He is One Who transforms. He never leaves us or forsakes us, and He continues to work in our midst and the world every day. If we are intent on being His community of believers, we have to emulate His example, or else we have to take a long moment to look in the mirror and ask ourselves if we are part of that community at all...
