


#### **Trent's Two Cents:**

This is the Week of Prayer for State Missions. There was an insert Sunday's bulletin with a daily prayer guide and an offering envelope for the Janie Chapman Offering for State Missions. We will be collecting this offering throughout the month of September. Our church goal is \$6,000.00. Janie Chapman (1867-1948) was a prominent mission leader in our state. Janie served her church and community in many ways and had a heart for reaching the lost. She became the first President of South Carolina Woman's Missionary Union in 1902 and served 22 years. Janie was a great leader and motivator. In 1919, before the formation of the Cooperative Program, she encouraged the South Carolina WMU to try to raise over one million dollars, and they exceeded her goal by giving \$1,487,647.00! In 1937 the state missions offering was named in her honor because of her service. Janie Chapman's personal motto was 1 Corinthians 15:58, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.' Janie Chapman dedicated her life to serving the Lord, and it was not in vain. May we all be as steadfast, immovable, and abounding in the work of the Lord as Janie Chapman. We can begin by praying for mission efforts in our state and giving to this mission offering. Your pastor,

Hebrews 12:14; I Peter 1:13-16; John 13:3-17, 31-35; James 1:22-27, 2:18-26 Many people in our world claim to be Christian, and yet many times we are confused by one's claim of salvation while living in a sinful way. This past Sunday, Trent showed to us that part of the Christian life is the pursuit of holiness. We have been instructed to live a life as the Family of Christ and in this world of peace, pursuing holiness. "You shally be holy, for I am holy," our Creator tells us. The fact that He is Lord of our lives should be reason enough to pursue this goal - just to be more like Him in every way each day.

But how do we show this each and every day? The Bible gives us answers in the books of John and James that the Christian life is not a matter of proclamation, but one where our actual life proves our words. To say it another way, we walk the walk if we talk the talk. Simply to proclaim Christ is not enough - even the demons know Him and tremble! If we simply proclaim Him, we deceive ourselves. Our works should spring out of the love we have for Christ. Jesus tells us that Himself in the book of John when He washes the feet of His disciples and proclaims to them, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

A life that pursues holiness and acts on the love of Christ is what turns a mere proclamation into belief. Thankfully, we have many ways that we can exercise our faith here at Washington. As the new church year begins, we still have many classes that are kicking off for us all to be a part of which I would highly encourage you to do! We should always be growing in our relationship with Christ, and these are excellent ways to do that.
