



What is the Reformation?

As the days are starting to get cooler and we head into Fall, we begin to see pumpkins and hay bales and Halloween decorations being placed in front yards; and heading towards the 31st of October, most are distracted by costumes and candy to remember another October 31st many years ago that paved the way for the people of God today. On that day in 1517, a monk by the name of Martin Luther tacked 95 Theses, or items for consideration, onto the church door in Wittenburg, Germany. Such a thing was not abnormal at the time, as scholars and priests would often do this to debate or discuss Biblical and theological ideas, but this time there was something different about this document, the man who put it on the door, and the Spirit of God that moved with it. This singular action would change the course of history, and summed up a wave of spiritual awakening in Europe that has helped spread the Gospel to the four corners of the earth. You see, Luther was a man driven by conviction - a conviction the Holy Spirit had laid on his heart and a conviction that had begun to boil in Europe in the minds and hearts of many that the only guide to God's truth should be His Word - not the Catholic church. Although Luther never intended to split the church, he was willing to risk such a thing for the sake of truth. What followed was a life of constant danger for Luther and his family, and yet again he was willing to risk this for the sake of the Gospel. Many other men and women of God suffered this same persecution that caused Luther to write in his hymn, A Mighty Fortress is Our God, Let goods and kindred go, this mortal life also; the body they may kill: God's truth abideth still - His kingdom is forever!" Over the next several weeks, I want to share the stories of some of the men of God of the Reformation that encapsulates the period from 1382 until 1685, hoping that this gives us some perspective this October 31st, the 206th anniversary of the Reformation, so that we understand truthfully a reality of persecution that we do not face today but that we need to live out in our faith walk in these words of Luther before he was excommunicated by the Catholic church for standing on God's Word: "Since [you] require of me a simple, clear and direct answer, I will give one, and it is this: Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures... [then] I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted. My conscience is captive to the Word of God...Here I stand. I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Amen."
