#### Babylon & Beyond: The Sovereignty of God in the Book of Daniel (6:1-9)

This week, we start the story we are perhaps the most familiar with in this book, and yet I think there are so many parts of this occurrence that we have missed in past readings. First, the age of Daniel, which we often glance over in this passage, is close to 80 years old. Even in his old age, Daniel is still serving God and now serving the Persian Empire. Second, his faithfulness as a worker. Even under a new regime with Darius, the new king could see something in Daniel that made him keep Daniel as a top official in the kingdom and then even plan to advance him to second in command. Third, his faithfulness to God. Notice that in the beginning of this story that Daniel is being rapidly advanced in importance to the new king, and the other officials of the empire did not like this. In fact, they were so jealous that they began to plot to bring Daniel down from his position. Notice, though, that they cannot find a political or personal reason to do so - he is upstanding, hard-working, and loyal. He was a valuable asset to the king. So look what the officials decide to do, specifically in verse 5 - they will use Daniel's relationship with God to their advantage by pitting Darius against God. Think about this for just a moment, and let that realization wash over you for a moment that Daniel's relationship with God was so deep, intimate, and defining of his life that the only way these officials could seek to bring him down was by it. I hope that would be the same problem people would have with you and with me - that our relationships with God were so strong and our walk so pure that the only chance they had of bringing us out of favor with others would be by pitting our walk with Christ against the world. In fact, that is constantly what Satan has attempted to do since the beginning of time. The reality of this passage and of our world today is that we are in a spiritual war - we do not often see the hand of Satan behind the physical effects in our world except for the lingering weight of his shadow behind the puppet strings we can see. And while we continually try to win others to Christ and live a faithful life to Him, Satan will continue to move pieces against us using our love for Christ as fuel for the fire he attempts to burn us in. May we all strive to build lives so devoted to Christ that would promote our enemies to say that the only thing they could use against us is our defining love for the

#### **Moore News:**

Over these past few weeks, we have looked at some of the personal spiritual disciplines that Christians must practice in order to grow in godliness. Godliness does not appear overnight; rather, it takes disci-plined work. There will be seasons when time seems short or you feel too tired from the day to partake in these spiritual disciplines. The purpose of this brief article is to encourage you to persevere through

Donald Whitney wrote, "Scripture confirms what observation perceives: Laziness never leads to godliness" (Whitney, 289). We must discipline ourselves for godliness (1 Tim. 4:7). Whitney adds, however, that "the godly person is a very busy person," meaning, most people will not have the time to daily partake in every spiritual discipline (Whitney, Persevering in Discipline Part 1).

As I reflect on my own practice of personal spiritual disciplines, I would say it has been helpful to combine many of the spiritual disciplines into one setting. For example, in the morning, I have combined devotional reading of Scripture, prayer, silence and solitude, and sometimes journaling and fasting are mixed in those other disciplines as well. Whitney also points out that the Holy Spirit gives us the desire to grow in godliness. Understanding this, we should seek the Lord's help in prayer and ask Him to help us stay faithful in practicing these spiritual disciplines so that we can grow in godliness.

Another help for seeking perseverance is found in fellowship. Fellowship, in the Biblical sense, is to talk about God and the things of God with other Christians. Within biblical fellowship, Christians can hold one another accountable and encourage one another to persevere in personal spiritual disciplines. This is what Paul tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:11, "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up." Whitney states, "God uses other people to bless us in ways we will never get alone" (Whitney Persevering in Discipline Part 3). Christians can and should stir one another up towards godliness, and we should hold each other accountable to persevere in our practice of personal spiritual disciplines.
