





The Five Solas: Sola Fide

Faith alone - like the other phrases we have seen so far, they reflect the confusion and murkiness of theology in the Reformation era. As we move further through the five solas, we will see that they form a phrase that so far for us reads - "...through faith alone, in Christ alone, as revealed in Scripture alone..." And while we today often would denounce the idea of working our way to heaven, there are still many people - some who would even say they are Christians - who have their faith in something other than Christ. Many times, we can hear this in something that sounds "Christian," but upon further inspection falls short of the fact that our faith should entirely be in Christ. If, when asked about our faith, we respond with "I prayed a prayer," or "I was baptized" or any other statement beginning with "I," or if we think our salvation can be lost by our actions, then we have missed the point. Our faith should not rest in anything besides Jesus. Hebrews 11, while listing the names of many men and women of the faith, tells us this: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." And when going through the names, the writer of Hebrews writes further "And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." See? He is, as the prophets, the apostles, and Jesus Himself noted, the cornerstone of our faith - a sure foundation. Faith in anything else will be as He Himself told us - sinking sand. Today, know that our foundation in Christ is sure and steady - He was foretold to save us from our sin; He conformed all of history to His will to bring Him to earth; He lived a perfect life, died, and rose again for us; He gave us His Word and instituted the church; and He has promised to return for His people. He has been nothing but faithful to us and proved Himself over and over again and still does today with His Word. With all of this, why would we put our faith in anything else but Christ alone?
