The Five Solas: Soli Deo Gloria Last week, we saw how these statements go from "alone" to "together" - grace alone through Christ alone by faith alone as God has told us through scripture. Today's statement caps this off... soli Deo gloria - all glory to God alone. Psalm 19 declares that "the heavens declare the glory of the Lord" and Psalm 24 - a Messianic psalm - declares Christ as the King of glory. Psalm 29 declares that God is worthy of glory to be proclaimed of His name, and when the New Testament writers describe Jesus, they always point to His glory both that can be seen like at the Transfiguration as well as that which is due His name by His very nature as God. This is His very reason for saving us, for guiding us, for sanctifying us - His eternal Kingdom and glory. Ephesians 2:10 says that believers "are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" and bring Him the glory. Revelation 5 tells us this very thing - that we were made as "a Kingdom and priests to our God" and that "to him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!" All of the story of creation, promise, redemption, and consecration, is for the eternal glory of our God, and we have any part in it by the sheer grace of Christ (sola gratia) by His work on the cross (solus Christus) by faith alone (sola fide) as the Bible has told us (sola scriptura) and all for the glory of God alone (soli Deo gloria). So as we approach Reformation Day on October 31st, let us all remember that God has worked His truth into existence and preserved it through the ages to this day to live in us - His people...His blood bought, grace filled, faithful people. All glory be to our God and to His Son!

Last night was our Night of Prayer – where we prayed for our nation as we approach this upcoming election. We had over 50 who gathered to pray for the following: 1. Christians would exercise their right to vote; 2. Current leaders; 3. Upcoming presidential election; 4. Our nation's repentance; 5. Our nation's peace; 6. The church. You will find the printouts we used last night as you walk into the fellowship hall and in the vestibule. I want to encourage you to pick one up and read the Bible verses that are connected with each prayer item and also to pray every day over these items.

There is power and prayer! I found a brief article online on the power of prayer that I hope will encourage you - "The power of prayer does not flow from us; it is not special words we say or the special way we say them or even how often we say them. The power of prayer is not based on a certain direction we face or a certain position of our bodies. The power of prayer does not come from the use of artifacts or icons or candles or beads. The power of prayer comes from the omnipotent One who hears our prayers and answers them. Prayer places us in contact with Almighty God, and we should expect almighty results, whether or not He chooses to grant our petitions or deny our requests. Whatever the answer to our prayers, the God to whom we pray is the source of the power of prayer, and He can and will answer us, according to His perfect will and timing.
