Psalm 100

Thankfulness is a cornerstone of the Christian life - for the ways that God sustains us with blessings each day as well as for the love and grace He has showed us through His Son. The Psalmist speaks about this in the 100th Psalm by outlining three things: the character of God, our response to Him, and the promise God gives us. Verse 3 shows us the character of God - that He is God alone. Not only is this a statement showing His power and authority, but it shows us our dependence on Him for all things. In fact, the Psalmist calls us His people - those He has made, and bought, and claimed. Even here, the picture of a shepherd with His sheep is used to further drive home that point. So how, then do we respond to this? Verses 1 & 2, which open the Psalm, call us to praise and serve the Lord with gladness. This indicates, on our part, our willingness to respond to Who He is. We know that there are many people, including Christians, who do not show thankfulness for anything in their lives. These verses are highlighting something important - that to be truly thankful is to respond to what God has done. Verse 4 continues in this light, and makes clear that when we see what He has done in our lives - giving us the very air we breathe as well as the grace and mercy He has shown us in Christ - we will not only come to Him willingly but with thanksgiving in our hearts. We will give ourselves away to Him as He has given Himself to us, and thankfulness will be the natural outpouring of our hearts. Does your life show thankfulness each and every day? Is gratitude your natural response? Because the final verse - verse 5 shows us the promise of this Psalm, which is that His love endures forever and He is always faithful. This, in turn, again promotes more gratitude in those who love Him and serve Him. Gratitude really does show the state of our relationship to the Lord, so are you feeling thankful today?

Come join the Operation Christmas Child Packing Party tomorrow night at 7pm as we work to touch thousands of lives all over the world with the Gospel! Bring your family and let's all serve the Lord together with gratitude in our hearts!
