Trent's Two Cents:

This month we are collecting the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. Every penny of this offering supports mission efforts around the world. Our church goal this year is \$25,000. To date we have collected \$17,809.00. Thank you for your generosity! I pray we will continue to give willingly, cheerfully, and generously to reach our goal and reach the nations with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Lottie Moon was an international missionary. She left home in 1872, at age 32, to share the gospel with the people of China. She spent the next 39 years, the remainder of her life, serving them in the name of Jesus. Lottie wrote many letters to church leaders and organizations here in America during her time in China. These letters show us her heart for reaching people with the gospel of Jesus Christ. In 1887 she wrote a letter to the Baptist women back home that was printed in the Foreign Mission Journal. This letter motivated Baptist women to be more organized and united in giving toward international missions. In the letter she urged them to dedicate the week preceding Christmas as "a week of prayer and selfdenial" as they sought the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on mission efforts across the world. She explained why she chose that week by asking, "Is not the festive season when families and friends exchange gifts in memory of The Gift laid on the altar of the world for the redemption of the human race, the most appropriate time to consecrate a portion from abounding riches and scant poverty to send forth the good tidings of great joy into all the earth?" Lottie Moon did her best to motivate the church to pray, to give, and send missionaries. May we unite, pray, give, send, and go, so the world may hear the gospel!
