GREETERS NEEDED!





In this last week before Christmas Day, we are often still caught up in the rush of things that we have to get done before we celebrate with family and friends. I know this has been the case for myself as there have been so many church events, family events, and other things going on that it can really cause our heads to spin, in a way. But in the midst of everything - whether that is chaos or celebration - I think it would be warranted for us to take a moment of introspection and look at this next week so that we can live intentionally each day. Two weeks ago, I wrote about the coming Messiah and the hope that we should feel from not only the celebration of His first coming, but also because of His imminent second coming. Not only should the story of His birth inspire a sense of hope and light within us, but it should also inspire joy in us. The Bible tells us over and over again that our God is a God of joy, and we see over & over again examples in the Bible of joy coming out in words and actions (David dancing before God, the Psalms, the disciples worshipping at the Ascension, etc.). Is joy part of your metaphorical bingo card this Christmas? Does the thought of Christ - the Creator of the world, the Sustainer Who guides it even now, the Savior Who came as a baby & died in our place - fill you with such joy that you can't contain it? Or is your joy being lost in the rush of Christmas preparations, Christmas parties & events, work, and family time? The Psalmist tells us in Psalm 96 to sing a new song - a song of adoration & praise, a song to all nations & peoples, a song that the earth itself sings to its Creator. This idea is mimicked in a song I sang years ago called "Estampie Natalis" which basically means "birthday dance." The idea of the song is that the story of Christmas translates into not only into our joy but that it overflows into action, whether that be prayer, or giving, or even song & dance. The text of it reads like this when translated to English:

> The boy born in Bethlehem, rejoice Jerusalem! The Son has assumed flesh - the Father most high. Per Gabriel's greeting, the virgin conceived a Son. He lies in the manger, He who rules without end. Alleluia! In joy of heart Let us adore the newborn Christ with a new song. In joy of this birth, let us bless the Lord, may the Holy Spirit be praised, give thanks unto God, alleluia!

So, this Christmas, how will our joy outpour? Praise be to God for His greatest gift, praise be to Christ Who came to save, & praise be to the Spirit for His work in us - His people! 2024 has been an outstanding year, and I believe that 2025 will be even better! Merry Christmas to you all and Happy New Year! I am blessed to be your Associate Pastor!

Matthew 1:20-21 says, "But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." What a glorious promise this is! J.C Ryle once wrote concerning verse 21, "The name Jesus means 'Savior.' It is the same name as Joshua in the Old Testament. It is given to our Lord because 'He saves His people from their sins.' This is His special office. He saves them from the guilt of sin, by washing them in His own blood. He saves them from the dominion of sin, by putting in their hearts the sanctifying Spirit. He sayes them from the presence of sin, when He takes them out of this world to rest with Him. He will save them from all the consequences of sin, when He shall give them a glorious body at the last day. Blessed and holy are Christ's people!" I hope you find joyful rest in Jesus as you reflect on His first advent.
